East Pye Solar

Statutory Consultation (Phase Two consultation)

Section 42 of the Planning Act 2008, Regulation 3 of the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 and Regulations 11 and 13 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 ('the 2017 Regulations').

Why we are sending you this letter

We have identified that you have an interest in land that may be affected by the proposed East Pye Solar Scheme, so we are inviting you to take part in the consultation about this Scheme. This letter explains more about the Scheme, why we have written to you, and how you can take part in the consultation.

The Applicant

Notice is hereby given that East Pye Solar Limited (Company registration number 14684189) of Unit 25.7 Coda Studios 189 Munster Road, London, England, SW6 6AW ('the Applicant'), proposes to apply to the Secretary of State ('SoS') for Energy Security and Net Zero under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 for a Development Consent Order for East Pye Solar ('the Application'). The Applicant is a subsidiary of Island Green Power.

The Scheme

The Applicant intends to build a new solar and energy storage project located on land near Long Stratton in South Norfolk ('the Scheme') within the administrative boundaries of South Norfolk Council and Norfolk County Council.

The Scheme is grouped into Sites 1- 10 (which includes the confirmed proposed option for the National Grid Substation within Site 1 (sub-site 1B). The Scheme also includes a Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) Site which is located to the south of Site 1. Sites 3 to 10 are concentrated to the east of Long Stratton with Sites 1, 2 and the BESS all located to the south-east of Great Moulton. Further details regarding the locations of the Sites are provided in the enclosed Section 48 notice under the 2008 Act.

The Scheme would connect into the existing National Electricity Transmission System 400kV overhead line, which runs north to south between Norwich Main and Bramford substations. The proposed DCO will, among other things, authorise:

- Construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of the solar PV electricity generating station and associated development including grid connection and energy storage facility;
- Compulsory acquisition of land, including interests in land, rights over land and imposition of restrictions, powers to override, suspend or extinguish rights over land and powers for the temporary use of land;
- The application, modification and/or disapplication of legislation including legislation relating to compulsory purchase and landlord and tenant; and
- Such ancillary, incidental and consequential provisions, licenses, property rights, permits and consents as are necessary and/or convenient.



East Pye Solar is an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development for the purposes of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works constitute development for which an EIA is required and the proposed application for a DCO will therefore be accompanied by an Environmental Statement. The Environmental Statement will provide a detailed description of East Pye Solar and assess its likely significant environmental effects.

Compulsory powers

The DCO will include authorisation of compulsory acquisition. However, the Applicant will always seek voluntary commercial arrangements with landowners first. In any case, the Applicant will not use these compulsory powers in relation to any homes, gardens or buildings. Consultation on East Pye Solar

The Scheme is currently in the pre-application stage of the DCO process. As such, the Applicant is required to carry out consultation on the proposed DCO Application before it is submitted. Your feedback as part of this statutory consultation will be considered before the Applicant finalises the DCO application.

We are writing to you as you have been identified as a consultee for the purpose of section 42(1)(d) of the 2008 Act as someone with one or more of the following interests in land that may be affected by East Pye Solar:

- (1) an owner, lessee, tenant or occupier of the land within the proposed boundary for the Scheme
- (2) a person with an interest in the land, or who has the power to sell and convey the land, or to release the land; or
- (3) a person who might be entitled to make a relevant claim as a result of the implementation of the Scheme or as a result of use of the land once the Scheme has been implemented.

This consultation also includes:

- Consultation with any persons with an interest in the land affected by the East Pye Solar (under section 42 and section 44 of the 2008 Act);
- Consultation with prescribed bodies, host, and neighbouring authorities (under section 42 of the 2008 Act);
- Consultation with the local community in the vicinity of East Pye Solar (under section 47 of the 2008 Act); and
- General public consultation on East Pye Solar (under section 48 of the 2008 Act).

Consultation for the DCO application took place between 18 June 2025 and 6 August 2025. As your interest in land was identified after the close of this consultation period, you have a separate period to provide feedback from **25 November 2025 to 14 January 2026**. During this time all the consultation material will remain available via the links below and the Project team is available to discuss any queries you may have.

In addition, section 48 of the 2008 Act and Regulation 13 of the 2017 Regulations require the Applicant to publicise its proposed DCO application. A formal Section 48 notice was publicised for the proposed application, a copy of which is enclosed with this letter for your information which includes a summary of the key elements of the proposals for the Scheme and provides further details regarding the consultation. **Please note that the consultation period specified in the section 48 notice is not the consultation period that applies to you, as explained above.**



Consultation materials

The Applicant has prepared a Preliminary Environmental Information Report ('PEIR'). This has been informed by the Scoping Opinion issued by the Planning Inspectorate ('PINS') and reports on the results of the EIA process that has been carried out to date. The PEIR forms the basis of this consultation and also includes a Non-Technical Summary. The purpose of the PEIR is to enable consultees to understand the likely environmental effects of the Scheme and to help inform consultation responses. It should be noted that the EIA is an ongoing process, and the design of the Scheme will continue to evolve during the pre-application stage.

Copies of the consultation materials are available free of charge to view and download online under the document library heading on the website for East Pye Solar (www.eastpyesolar.co.uk) and include:

- The PEIR (including appendices, plans and figures);
- A Non-Technical Summary of the PEIR;
- Plans and maps explaining the details of the nature and location of East Pye Solar; and
- Additional documents explaining the statutory consultation process including the Consultation Information Booklet, Feedback Form and Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC).

These documents are free to read and download from the East Pye Solar website.

Hard copies of the SoCC, PEIR, NTS, maps and plans, and other consultation materials are available for inspection free of charge at the Long Stratton Library until November 2025. From December 2025, consultation materials will only be available to view and download from the Scheme website.

Hard copies of the other consultation materials, including the PEIR, are available upon request (some of which are subject to payment). Details of how to request these documents and the related charges, if any, are set out in the enclosed section 48 notice. **Please note that from December 2025, documents will only be available to view online, as the community access points mentioned in the notice will no longer be hosting materials. Please do get in touch if you need any hard copies of the consultation documents.**

The Applicant held a series of in-person and a community webinar during the statutory consultation period. Details of these events are listed in the enclosed section 48 notice.

Responses and representations will form the basis of a Consultation Report, which will be submitted as part of the DCO application. Responses may be made public or made available to the SoS, PINS, and other relevant statutory bodies, in accordance with the requirements of the 2008 Act and data protection legislation. Personal details will be held securely, kept confidential where possible and used solely for purposes in connection with the statutory consultation, DCO process and further development of the Scheme. You do not have to provide any personal information, but this information will help the Applicant to understand the range of responses and enable the Applicant to send you further information relating to East Pye Solar. Please see the enclosed section 48 notice for further information.

SECTION 48 PLANNING ACT 2008

REGULATION 4 OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE PLANNING (APPLICATIONS: PRESCRIBED FORMS AND PROCEDURE) REGULATIONS 2009.

Notice publicising a proposed application for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to construct, operate, maintain and decommission a solar photovoltaic (PV) generating station, with a generating capacity of more than 50 megawatts (MW) and associated infrastructure on land near Long Stratton in South Norfolk (East Pye Solar).

Notice is hereby given that East Pye Solar Limited (Company Number 14684189) of Unit 25.7 Coda Studies, 189 Munster Road, London, England, SW6 6AW (the Applicant), proposes to apply to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 for a Development Consent Order for East Pye Solar (the Scheme).

The Scheme will consist of:

- The solar array sites, which will include solar panels, conversion units and inverters, 132kV substations located within the solar array sites and up to two 400kV substations;
- A new National Grid substation operated by National Grid Electricity Transmission plc and associated electrical infrastructure along with other ancillary works required to facilitate the export of electricity from the Scheme to the national grid;
- The Scheme is anticipated to include works and relate to the existing 400kv overhead line and associated pylon(s), for example the relocation/moving of the existing pylon(s), new pylons, temporary replacement pylon(s) and restringing of the overhead line;
- A Battery Energy Storage System (BESS);
- A Cable Route Corridor for the underground electricity cables to run between the solar array sites to connect to the BESS and National Grid substation;
- Associated infrastructure, mitigation and enhancement measures and other ancillary works, for example, enclosures and fencing, security, drainage, earthworks, highways and access works, mitigation and enhancement measures, temporary works compounds and work sites.

The Scheme will cover a combined area of approximately 2,232 hectares (ha) including the Cable Route Corridor and will consist of the following sites:

- Site 1 (sub-sites 1A, 1B): South-west of Great Moulton;
- Site 2 (sub-sites 2A, 2B, 2C): North-west of Pulham Market and South-east of Great Moulton;
- Site 3 (sub-sites 3A, 3B): South of Hempnall;
- Site 4 (sub-sites 4A, 4B): North of Long Stratton and South of Tasburgh;
- Site 5 (sub-sites 5A, 5B): South-west of Hempnall;
- Site 6: South-west of Hempnall and North of Silver Green;
- Site 7 (sub-sites 7A – 7L): Hempnall is located South-west, Tasburgh to the West, Saxlingham Nethergate to the North and Woodton to the South-east;
- Site 8 (sub-sites 8A, 8B): South-west of Brooke and North-east of Hempnall;
- Site 9: South of Brooke; and
- Site 10 (sub-sites 10A – 10E): North-east of Woodton and South-west of Seething.

The BESS is proposed to be located in the BESS Site and the location of the National Grid Substation will either be in the National Grid Substation Site or sub-Site 1. The Scheme would connect into the existing National Electricity Transmission System 400kV overhead line, which runs north to south between Norwich Main and Bramford substations.

The Scheme will operate for up to 60 years and will provide enough energy to power approximately 115,000 homes annually.

The proposed DCO will authorise:

- Construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of the solar PV electricity generating station and associated development including grid connection and energy storage facility;
- Compulsory acquisition of land, including interests in land, rights over land and imposition of restrictions, powers to override, suspend or extinguish rights over land and powers for the temporary use of land;
- The application, modification and/or disapplication of legislation including legislation relating to compulsory purchase and landlord and tenant; and
- Such ancillary, incidental and consequential provisions, licenses, property rights, permits and consents as are necessary and/or convenient.
- The Scheme is an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development for the purposes of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the Scheme constitutes development for which an EIA is required and the proposed application for a DCO will therefore be accompanied by an Environmental Statement (ES). The ES will provide a detailed description of the Scheme and its likely significant environmental effects. Information compiled so far about the Scheme's likely significant environmental effects is set out for consultation in a Preliminary Environmental Information Report (the PEIR) and summarised in a Non-Technical Summary (NTS).

Statutory Consultation

The Applicant is undertaking a statutory consultation on the proposals for East Pye Solar between 18 June 2025 and 6 August 2025.

Electronic copies of the Consultation Information Leaflet, Consultation Feedback Form, SoCC, PEIR, PEIR NTS, maps and plans explaining the statutory consultation process and details of the nature and location of the Scheme can be found on the Applicant's website in the document library at www.eastpyesolar.co.uk. These documents will be free to read and download from the Applicant's website from 18 June 2025 to 6 August 2025.

A hard copy of the Consultation Information Leaflet, Consultation Feedback Form, SoCC, PEIR, PEIR NTS, maps and plans will be available for inspection at Long Stratton Library from 18 June 2025 until 6 August 2025.

Hard copies of the SoCC and PEIR NTS will also be available for inspection free of charge from 18 June 2025 until 6 August 2025 at all community access points listed.
