

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on 8 September 2025

Public Open Forum: Concern was raised about recent loud music events at Foxhole and Councillor John Cook confirmed that he had received many complaints that were being followed up

Planning: 2025/1970 - Land East of Windy Lane - Proposed agricultural barn with solar panels and polytunnel. Erect shed and partly completed farm track to support agricultural activities- Retrospective Application - PC recommended refusal as a building of 276sqm and some 8 metres in height, with the capacity to install an additional floor as this cannot be reasonably required for the needs of a small agricultural holding of less than 5ha. In addition, the size and height of the building will be obtrusive in this rural landscape. Also the previous decision notice states that SNC would not support a future application

2025/2193 - Hawthorne Cottage, Pitts Hill - Conversion of a garage to a home gym. New patio and decorative curve brick wall. Revised garage elevation and revised windows. - The PC recommended approval.

2025/0006 - Calico Cottage, Foxhole. Extension to existing dwelling to create annexe following demolition of agricultural structure. - The PC recommended refusal as the application does not comply with policy DM 3.7. The application has subsequently been approved by the Council.

Planning Enforcement: The PC agreed to accept the response regarding the planning enforcement complaint but will continue to closely monitor current and any future enforcement issues. It was agreed to send a letter to SNC supporting those affected by the noise issues in Foxhole.

East Pye Solar: The PC will sign a joint objection letter with other affected village Parish Councils. Any developments will be posted on the new East Pye Solar page on the PC website.

Flooding: A meeting will be organised with other partner organisations to discuss actions required to alleviate future flooding

Play Area: All repairs required by the annual safety inspection have been completed

Work is continuing on the refurbishment of the finger post at the junction of Norwich Road and Shotesham Lane


