Chapel Talk

As I listened to the news on 14 October, I was overwhelmed by the excitement and emotion expressed, as the hostages from Gaza were released! You'll remember that Hamas released all 20 of the remaining living Israeli hostages and Israel released nearly 2,000 Palestinian prisoners and detainees as part of the cease-fire deal to end the war.

It's surely impossible to imagine the trauma experienced by these hostages having been held captive for so long, and in such desperate conditions. This also made me think how easily we can all be held captive by our thoughts... maybe fears about the future, financial worries or health concerns to name but a few. When such thoughts crowd our heads and dominate our thinking, we lose our freedom to enjoy life. Good news... as with the hostages, we too can be set free! God doesn't want us to live in captivity. We can be released from guilt, or shame, or fear, or doubt; indeed, anything that might be holding us captive.

Do you feeling anxious, depressed or held captive by your thoughts? Ask Jesus to set you free. He will, no negotiations needed! (Read John's Gospel chapter 8 verse 33)

There are some Samaritan's Purse boxes, along with suggestions of how to fill a box, at the back of the church. The deadline for filling these boxes is also the 9th and so please either fill a whole box or leave some items at the back of the church to be placed in a shared box. If you have filled one of these boxes in previous years, the gift ideas are the same – toys, personal care items and school supplies. The age ranges for the gifts are boys or girls 2 – 4 years old, 5 – 9 years old and 10 -14 years old. All the information for filling a box and including a financial donation to help cover the cost of getting the shoeboxes to their destination can be found at occ.Samaritans.purse.org.uk. Any shoebox can be used to fill with items – it is suggested that an ordinary box is covered in Christmas paper, with the lid covered separately, and an elastic band holding them together.

Notes on the Parish Council Meeting held 13 October 2025

Councillor John Cook talked about the local Government re-organisation; the aim is to create simpler, more sustainable Government Structures. John also mentioned the Streetwave scheme which has been monitoring the mobile signal in rural areas using waste collection vehicles.

East Pye Solar – The PC urges any concerned parishioners that have received a 'Compulsory Purchase' letter or similar communication from East Pye to get in touch with the Clerk Julie King. If you are concerned, the PC may be able to offer assistance or advice.

Highways – The footpaths have been walked and inspected by the PC. Replacement posts are currently being investigated.

Speeding – The Council has been analyzing the data from the SAM 2 device. Due to the high numbers of speeding vehicles, the PC is approaching our local Community Police Officer to request more police speed checks in the village.

Community Speed Watch – The PC is keen to start a Community Speed Watch group in the village but volunteers are needed! Can you help? If interested and you are keen to help reduce the speeding in the village, please contact Jackie Lee-Smith. Email: jackieleesmith5@gmail.com.

Poor Mobile Phone Signal – The Council urges as many people as possible in the village to give feedback on the NCC website: norfolk.gov.uk and type in **Mobile Coverage in Norfolk** to complete the form on 'your mobile experience'.

Allotments – The main gate has been repaired. There is also one half plot available for rent. Please contact Julie King if you are interested.

Flood Action Group – A representative from the PC will be attending a meeting with the Environment Agency in November.

Community Library – It was agreed to create a Community Library in the phone Kiosk on The Green on a trial basis.
