Lynda and I recently had a holiday in bonnie Scotland. One of the things that always impresses me as we travel around that beautiful country is the sheer amount of rock and stone on view. We visited Aberdeen, known with good reason as 'the granite city'. We saw mountains of course - lots of them - city walls, cathedrals, houses and sea defences. All these give such a sense of strength, stability and a sense of safety and security! I can see where we get the phrases "rock solid" or "solid as a rock" from. This is all in sharp contrast to our current world situation, where things seem increasingly unstable and insecure! As I gazed in awe one day at some of the sea defences in Fife on the east coast, it made me think of the numerous occasions in the Bible that Jesus is described as our Rock. The Psalmist said on one occasion, "He alone is my rock and my salvation; he is my fortress, and I will not be shaken." This and similar Bible passages use the imagery of "rock" to describe God's strength and steadfastness. We all need that sense of safety and security and Jesus offers to be our foundation stone and our safe place if we only ask Him. To be. I'll leave the final word to the Psalmist...

"The Lord ... set my feet on a rock and gave me a firm place to stand."

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on 9 June 2025

Public Open Forum: The Village Hall treasurer sought clarification of aspects of the loan offered by the PC to assist with the Hall's annual insurance premium.

County Councillor Alison Thomas provided more details of the reasons behind the traffic signals on A140 at Swainsthorpe that have been causing so much inconvenience and the consequent increase of traffic on village roads. She also updated the meeting on the decision of the County Council to support, on financial grounds, a single unitary authority for the county in the proposed reorganisation of local government. The County Council has appointed Stephen Faulkner to lead on responses to the various Solar Panel proposals in the county.

Co-option of Parish Councillors: The PC unanimously agreed to co-opt Elizabeth Utting and Paul Bowen.

Planning: SNC has approved the applications to remove a condition on Hill Pond, West End, for a single storey rear extension and side porch at The Stables, The Green and for tree work to Orchard House, Church Hill.

Enforcement: It was agreed to write to SNC about the on-going breaches of planning control at Barefoot Farm, Windy Lane.

East Pye Solar: It was agreed to set up a working party to prepare the response to the impending consultation that will run from 18 June to 6 August. There will be a special meeting to finalise our response to the consultation on 4 August. The promotors are holding an event to publicise their proposals in the Village Hall on 3 July from 1430 to 1930. The PC will write to the Leader of SNC to ask how the council intends to respond to the impending consultation.

Local Government Reorganisation: The PC was minded to support the proposal for a single unitary authority for the county but would study the various published documents before giving further consideration to the issue.

The VE Day anniversary celebrations: The celebrations raised \pounds 1,898.90 for village hall funds.

Damage to the War Memorial grass: County highways will be asked for an estimate of the cost of installing posts to protect the grass from damage by vehicles.

Community Action Norfolk: - the PC's silver membership is to be renewed.

PC Notice Board: the possibility of locating a notice board in West End/Saxlingham Thorpe is being investigated.

Next Meeting is scheduled for 14 July 2025.
